

ARE YOU A RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNER?

Health Hazard:

Dog Fouling is a health hazard and faeces can contain 'Toxocara' which may cause eye, liver, brain and respiratory problems such as asthma, hepatitis and epilepsy.

Cleaning up after your dog: It is an offence under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 not to clean up after your dog. Every responsible dog owner should train their dog to go at home. When you take your dog out for a walk you should always carry a poop scoop or plastic bag just in case your dog should get caught short. FORGETTING TO TAKE A POOP SCOOP OR PLASTIC BAG IS NO DEFENCE. Cleaning up after your dog is an essential part of your responsibility as a dog owner. It is permissable for a properly sealed bag or poop scoop to be deposited in a normal street litter bin, or where provided, in special Dog Waste bins.

Training your dog: Your dog can be trained to relieve itself on command. More information on toilet training your pet is available from Charnwood Borough Council.

IT IS AN OFFENCE NOT TO CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG Fixed Penalty - £25.00 MAXIMUM PENALTY - £1000.00

So come on, be fair to everyone, become a responsible dog owner and clean up after your dog, whether it be on pavements, roadways, grass verges, alleyways, parks, in fact anywhere with public access.

IF YOU KNOW OF SOMEONE WHO IS ALLOWING THEIR DOG TO FOUL YOU CAN RING (01509) 63428 AND REPORT TO THE DOG WARDEN.

The Role & Responsibilities of the Parish Council

Sileby Parish Council is made up of 15 Councillors, 7 for St Mary's Ward and 8 for St Gregory's Ward. The Parish Year begins in May when the Chairman of the Council is elected. Councillor Mrs Betty Crick is the Chairman for 2001 / 2002. The Financial Year runs from 1st April to 31st March.

The Full Parish Council Meeting is held on the third Thursday of each month at Sileby Community Centre, commencing at 7.30 p.m. Councillors are available from 7.00 p.m. for informal public questions. There are also committees – Parks, Community Centre, Policy, Planning, which meet on the 4th Thursday of each month commencing 7.30 p.m. at Sileby Community Centre and General Purposes and Planning, which meet on the 1st Thursday of each month commencing at 7.30 p.m. All meetings are open to the public but no public speaking time is allowed, except at the discretion of the Chairman of the relevant meeting.

Sileby Parish Council is responsible for Sileby Memorial Park, Sileby Cemetery, Martins Walk and Sileby Community Centre. Play areas at Greedon Rise, Flaxland Crescent and Wallace Drive are leased from Charnwood Borough Council. Sileby Parish Council employs a grounds maintenance contractor to maintain all areas. Also employed are a part-time Cemetery Keeper, a handy person who picks up litter and keeps in a tidy condition the Memorial Park, the Pinfold and some footpaths within the village as well as general maintenance work to Council property and a cleaner for Sileby Community Centre. Bookings for Sileby Community Centre are made by the Clerk (01509) 813075.

Sileby Parish Council reports to Leicestershire County Council highway problems, street lighting problems and public footpath problems. Problems regarding the car park and toilets and Sileby Brook, through the village to Dudley Bridge are reported to Charnwood Borough Council.

Sileby Parish Council is consulted on all planning applications which affect the village, by Charnwood Borough Council, who are the planning authority and make the decisions on planning applications for the whole borough. The Parish Council is also consulted by other agencies who may be undertaking work in the village.

Sileby Parish Council is purchasing official medals for the Queen's Golden Jubilee. These will be presented to residents who have made a contribution to the village. The Parish Council would welcome names put forward for consideration. They will also be available to any child born to parents residing in Sileby in 2002, names to be submitted to Clerk (01509) 813075.

Strictly for adults

For the person who has everything, for someone special or for a treat for yourself.

- Place some glace cherries in a jar and cover with Brandy.
- 2. Cover the top of the jar with greaseproof paper.
- 3. Leave for at least five days but preferably for a week. Top up with Brandy if necessary during the week.
- 4. Chocolate. Any of the following are suitable: Sainsburys Luxury Belgian milk or dark chocolate, Cadburys Dairy milk or Bournville and Galaxy. If using Cadburys or Galaxy add a small amount of white fat (Trex is ideal) when the chocolate has melted. This stops the chocolate setting too quickly. Cake covering chocolate is not suitable. It is better to use a small amount of chocolate as a large amount will set before you have dipped the cherries. Break up about eight or nine squares of chocolate and place in a basin over a container of hot water to melt. Do not let the basin come into contact with the water. When the chocolate has melted mix in the white fat if necessary. Then using a teaspoon take a cherry out of the

jar and drop into the chocolate, with another teaspoon coat the cherry with chocolate and lift it out onto either foil or Bakewell parchment. Swirl a tiny amount of chocolate on top to give a professional look. Dip the remaining cherries in chocolate. Use a clean basin to melt more chocolate if required. Leave chocolates to set overnight and place in paper or foil sweet cases. They can then be put in a container or placed on a doily on a paper plate and covered with clingfilm and decorated with ribbon and gift card. More cherries can be put into the liquid in the jar if desired and topped up with Brandy. When this batch is removed discard the liquid (there will not be a shortage of volunteers to sample this brew) and start a new batch with fresh Brandy.

For a non alcoholic version just dip glace cherries in melted chocolate.
