



BUT – we soon discovered – what do you mean by 'pale applewhite'? Four or five contenders were found and painted in different places on the plaster. And none of them were right. The painters were visibly impatient. Until – another answer to prayer – Shirley went into Wilco's and found a pot of something call Faraway.

"By Jove, she's got it. I think she's got it!" Even Clive, fresh back from his Spanish water-colouring holiday, with the pot in his hand, thought she's got it. And the more square metres of wall and ceiling covered the more certain it was.

One thing was striking: the shade was so delicate and light falls so differently on different surfaces, some seemed to have had one coat and the others two. But the overall rightness is powerful, as well as the match with the large areas of carpet and the colour on the doors and skirting. General rejoicing.

And I find myself feeling, the whole thing is a parable of that other vital question: the schedule of charges for the hire of the centre. Here too the right things seems to be work in broad areas. or sessions - three sessions a day. morning, afternoon and evening 21 sessions a week - with a price per The equivalent of 'pale session. applewhite' seemed to be £25 a regular session, with concessions for special and perhaps significant increases for merely occasional users.

Paint it on the wall and see what it looks like.

Thank God Jim has agreed to be the Booking Secretary. And now, are we going to find the right person (people) to be the cleaner(s)? Will three hours a week be the amount of time that is needed and will £6 an hour be the right wage?

I'm not sure this is what I was ordained for, but it's good fun if you don't weaken.

SILEBY SWIMMING POOL FUND

Public interest in the Fund has deteriorated over the years and despite advertising for help there are now only three members of the committee. People have moved on and away but no newcomers have joined either the fundraising or latterly the management of the fund. The balance is approximately £50,000.

Edward, Hands & Lewis Solicitors, gave us free advice to help us obtain charitable status, to protect the money and groups objectives.

Changes in the management and control of the schools over the past few years means the earmarked building land at Redlands School is not available. This is not the fault of the School or its Governors but the ruling of County Hall acting on Government regulations.

The charities Commission would only accept 'active associations'. With no realistic prospect of a swimming pool in Sileby and no current fundraising the Sileby Swimming Pool Fund was classed as dormant. Their only help would be to try to return any proven gifts to the donors. Any money left after this lengthy and costly process would be distributed to other organisations. Those groups would not have to have any connections either with Sileby or Swimming.

The committee decided not to opt for charitable status. The fund is held in an account at the Halifax. This account achieves the highest interest rate possible for an organisation as opposed to a private account. Grants from the interest are available for any official group in Sileby organising Swimming activities. The Youth Club has benefited once and both Sileby Schools have had grants for the last two years. Interest on all accounts is low at present so there is not a huge amount available.
