#### **DOG FOULING - SILEBY MEMORIAL PARK**

Sileby Parish Council continues to receive many complaints about the problem of dog fouling on the Memorial Park and around the village.

The vast majority of dog owners are responsible and 'pick up' but there are the minority of villagers who feel that they are 'above the law'. It is an offence not to 'pick up' after your dog has fouled and fixed penalty tickets of £50 can be issued. If taken to court there is a maximum fine of £1000. Sileby Memorial Park is a recreation area for all to enjoy. Everyone should be able to use the facilities without having to check for dog mess everywhere. THIS IS A HEALTH

HAZARD and has caused the death of children in the UK who have been in contact with dog faeces.

Please support Sileby Parish Council by advising the Parish Office 01509 813075, the name of anyone who is seen not 'picking up' after their dog has fouled. This information will be acted upon. The consequences of persons ignoring their responsibilities may result in 1. All dogs must be on lead or 2. NO dogs allowed on the Memorial Park at any time.

It is the Policy of Sileby Parish Council that no action is taken when correspondence or information is received anonymously.

#### <u>LOCAL ELECTIONS - 3<sup>RD</sup> MAY 2007</u> DON'T MISS OUT - IT MATTERS!

On **3<sup>rd</sup> May 2007** local elections will be taking place to elect councillors to your Parish Council. This is the chance to have your say by voting for the people you want to be councillors to help look after your community or possibly becoming a councillor yourself and help shape it.

The Government is keen for local communities to have a real influence on those things which directly affect them. For this reason Parish Councils are to be given new powers so that they have an even more important role to play in local affairs. Not only will Parish Councils be given an increased role in delivering local services but they will also be given a stronger voice in representing the community's interests and make sure that local people are listened to.

If you have considered being in a position to be part of deciding how your community is run and developed, now is the time for you to come forward. Providing you are a registered local government elector for the area (or meet certain other requirements) and will be at least 18 years old on election day you can stand for election. There are no other special qualifications needed to be a councillor. You just need to care about your community and be keen enough to make a difference. If you are interested and want to know more you can contact your local Parish Clerk or your District Council for more details and to check that you are eligible to stand as a councillor. Alternatively, you can contact the Association of Parish Councils on 01509 816400 or email <a href="mailto:lraplc@btconnect.com">lraplc@btconnect.com</a> to obtain an information pack.

Whether or not you decide to become a councillor, your vote in the elections is still important. It is your opportunity to help decide who runs your Parish Council.

This year you will be able to vote at your usual polling station, which will be open longer than before (7.00am to 10.00pm), or you can simply request a postal form from your District Council's elections office.

Remember, every vote counts and your vote could tip the balance!

#### Update on Sileby Baptist Church building project

hanks to all those of you who came along to the Christmas Fayre in December (seems a long time ago now!). The day went very well, we had a great time and managed to raise another £393.73 for our building project. The total currently stands at a fantastic £169,000.17 we still need another £50,000, but we're optimistic that we'll get what we need. For such a small fellowship we're stunned to have

raised more than £37,000 in the last year alone!

The latest...

As you may have noticed, if you pass by the Cossington Road end of the village at all, the church demolition has not only

begun but is

now actually complete! Here are a few photos of the 'progress'.

#### A reminder of what we're doing

For those of you who don't know what the church was like inside, there were two or three different levels, just within the main hall, which often caused us problems and posed a safety hazard at times. This has been resolved by the builders levelling the site, getting rid of all the steps.





This will make it a much more accessible building for all the community, wheels and legs alike.

The outside toilets have been knocked down (hurray!) and we'll be getting lovely new inside toilets with a baby changing facility included.

There will be wiring, etc. installed with a view to later adding a lift for disabled access to the upstairs of the building (when further funds become available).

We will be creating a whole new room above the main worship hall, possibly for use in our youth work.

The new larger kitchen will have both hot AND cold running water (we only had cold before); as the previous kitchen was only big enough for two people at a time, this will make the kitchen a much more workable space.

As we will have more room within the building we will no longer need to hire out the village institute for our Sunday school classes each week.


