
WANT TO STAY ACTIVE?





The Best Garden Competition for 2004


Once again the popular best garden competition is being run for this year.

The war memorial.

I've been standing here perusing all these names set in the stone, that someone carved with feelings of pride.

For these were men of Sileby who went off to fight in wars, and their greatest claim to fame is that they died.

These were not professional men who had been trained to fight in war's they were taken from the factories and the local village stores.

But they stood against a tyranny that threatened all the world, and wherever they were sent they kept the British flag unfurled.

They fell upon the beaches, in the trenches and the fields, in all the famous theatre's of war,

Like Arnhem and Tobruk but some of them were took, in places we'd not heard about before.

But wherever they were sent their only sole intent, was to keep the Hun away from England's shores.

They stood for King and country and there their blood was shed, they gave their lives whilst fighting for the cause.

Now to most of us in Sileby it is just beyond belief, that this stone gets desecrated which causes so much grief. We owe these men a debt of honour that we never can re-pay for it was for our tomorrow that they gave their today.

The next time you are passing through the old memorial park, just stop and think awhile about those days so very dark. And as you read that list of names I'm sure that you will see, they made this final sacrifice for the like of you and me.

So please respect this monument don't vandalise the stone, it stands here to remind us that these men did not come home, We also should remember we are never free of wars, and the next names carved upon the stone could possibly be your's.

Dear Talk@Sileby

The Sileby Trade and Retail organisation for the Development of Enterprise, or Sileby TRADE, is an organisation founded to address the wider aspects of the village affecting traders, retailers and associated businesses. The second meeting of the association was held on Monday 8th March at Sileby WMC, and although relatively few members of the business community were present, a number of pertinent points were raised about the future of the village. First amongst these was the new development of the High Street, which many felt would be ineffective at giving pedestrians easier access to the Shops and businesses around the King Street/ High Street junction. Indeed, the corner

outside the Olde Corner Shop was felt to be dangerous, as the raised round was level with the path and there was no physical deterrent to prevent cars or lorries cutting the corner and endangering those on the pathway. Parking in and around Swan Street and the Banks was also felt to be woefully inadequate to support this second centre of trade, and with the forthcoming housing developments this situation would only worsen.

The members of Sileby TRADE would like the Parish, Borough and County councils to consult with them to improve not only these matters, but the whole future of the centres of business in Sileby. They would like to see a plan put forward that would promote Sileby as a centre for economic development, and propose solutions to the regeneration of the infrastructure that will allow that. The next meeting of Sileby TRADE will be on Monday 19th April, and all persons involved with the Sileby business community would be welcome to attend. Sileby TRADE is a forum for such persons to discuss all aspects of business in the community, and by drawing on the combined experiences of such people it intends to find a way forward for Sileby that will benefit not just those trading here, but the whole population by providing the shopping and commercial centre a village of this size deserves.


